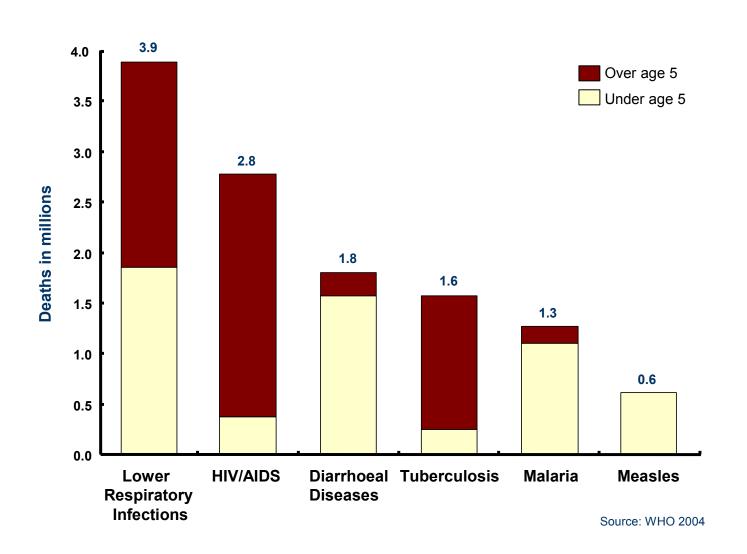


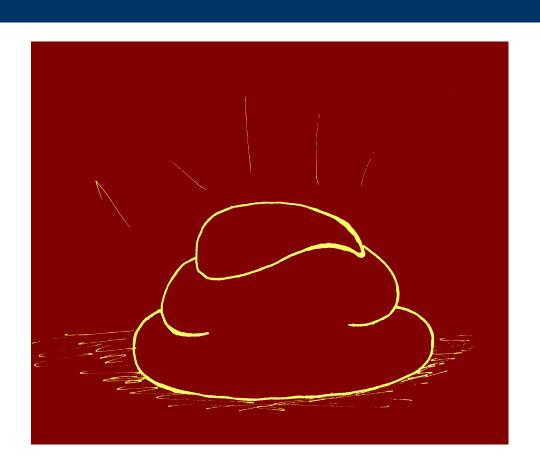


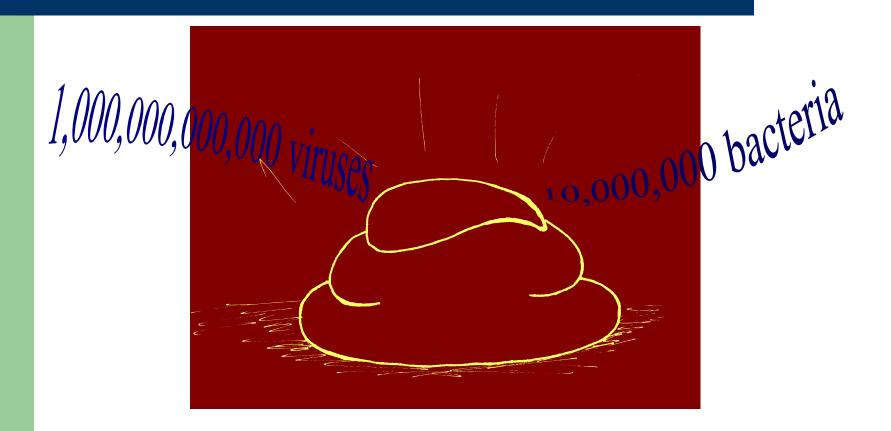
Why Handwashing?

- Reviews suggest that handwashing can reduce diarrhoel infections by 47%
- And the risk of intestinal infections by 48%
- And 19-45% of respiratory tract infections
- Could save over a million lives
- Feasible and cost effective
- The "do-it-yourself" vaccine
- And prevent SARS and Avian Flu

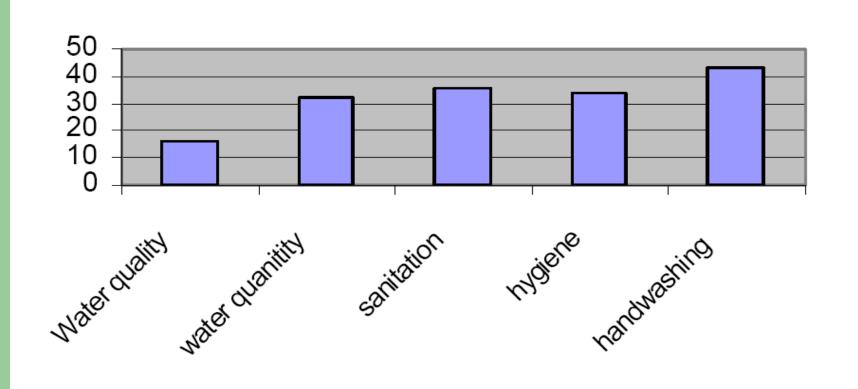
Deaths from Infectious Diseases Global Estimates 2002

Handwashing in Vietnam

- Evidence suggests that handwashing with soap is rare
- Household observations:
 - No households had soap placed where it could be easily accessible for handwashing
 - Mothers said they used soap when hands were visibly dirty or smelly, but did not mention after the toilet or after cleaning up children

How can we catalyze behavior change?

Objective of Handwashing Initiative

- To reduce morbidity and mortality among children under five through an integrated communications campaign promoting handwashing with soap to prevent diarrhoeal diseases.
- It utilizes Public-Private-Partnerships to effectively promote handwashing with soap.
